In Part 2 (one week after Part 1), each participant will deliver a five-minute presentation to the group and receive feedback and suggestions from other participants and the instructor. This will be a safe environment in which to practice and build skills and confidence and gain experience in front of a supportive group.

This workshop will be limited to ten participants in order to provide everyone with individual coaching and time for presenting.
